COT CERTIFICATION EXAM PREP COURSE (3 IJCAHPO CE Credits)

This primer will cover the basics of genetics, how it causes retinal diseases, the present status of gene therapy in treatment trials, and the importance of gene testing in these inherited retinal diseases.

This course will cover the aspects of retinal diseases that are important for a technician in a cataract/refractive practice. Topics such as macular puckers/holes, cystoid macular degeneration, age-related macular degeneration, retinal detachments, and endophthalmitis will be discussed.

- 10:15–11:15 a.m. **OCULAR ONCOLOGY IN 2024: WHAT DO WE NEED TO KNOW (1 IJCAHPO CE Credit)**

This course will highlight the most common intraocular tumors, discuss ways to identify these lesions with multimodal imaging, and highlight the available treatment options. We will also highlight the how technicians, photographers and nurses can impact the patient's experiences.

This course will discuss retinal imaging modalities that are important for the anterior segment practice. Fundus photography, optical coherence tomography, fundus autofluorescence, and ultrawide-field imaging provide valuable information for the anterior segment practice. Numerous examples of diseases with images will be given.

This course will discuss the ANTERION and its level of workflow efficiency that brings together corneal topography and tomography, biometry measurements, and IOL calculations. There will be a review of the four applications that are available on the ANTERION-Cornea, Cataract, Metrics, and the Imaging app. High quality results will be shown from all four applications.
- 2:00–3:00 p.m. **MULTIMODAL IMAGING AND MANAGEMENT OF NON-INFECTIOUS UVEITIS (1 IJCAHPO CE Credit)**

During this lecture, the main imaging modalities used in uveitis, as well as their pearls and common applications will be discussed. Imaging modalities that will be illustrated include fundus photography, fluorescein angiography, indocyanine green angiography, optical coherence tomography, and optical coherence angiography. Principles of treatment of non-infectious uveitis will also be reviewed.
